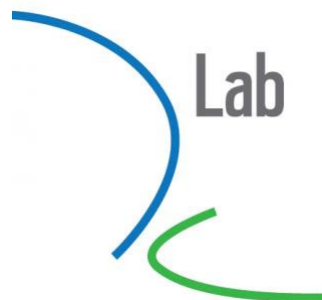
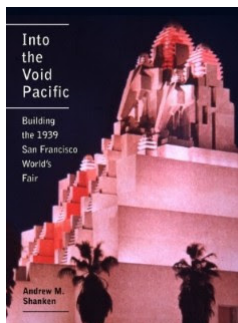


RSVP to the Global Urban Humanities Open House!

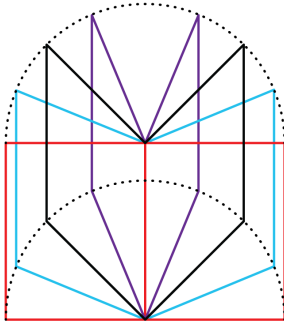
